Archives help us help researchers with early history of Framingham State Alumni

Associate Professor Dr. Kelly Kolodny is researching the first class of Framingham Normal School. We were able to provide her with materials and photos from our archives. Dr. Kolodny is chair of the FSU education department and a recipient of an IAFSA Whitney Travel Grant.

An email query sent us back to the archives to look for three women from Concord, Massachusetts who graduated from Framingham Normal School in 1846, 1848, and 1850 and taught for the New England Freedman's Aid Society in Maryland, Virginia, and South Carolina during the Civil War
